INTENDED PROJECT SEQUENCE

POTENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES

5. Online learning formats from SeneCura, technical KnowHow from Paracelsus Medical Private University
6. Knowhow of the trainings and adult education of Pro Senectute
7. Publication of the results/dissemination of the materials (brochures) via the Federal Association of Care and Nursing Homes Austria as well as support in the implementation on site in the nursing homes
8. Trainers are provided by the three organizations as well as SeneCura

FURTHER PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- Create awareness of the issue of violence in elderly care
- Implementation of the findings in care facilities
- Awareness raising not only in care facilities but also in politics □ Communication of findings and demands to politics

ANALYSIS OF THE CURRENT SITUATION

- Short paper – How is the topic of violence in elderly care reviewed in the scientific literature? What can be said about the situation in Austria?
- Based on already existing material of the three organizations
- What papers are already available to the project?
- Existing literature is used and built upon, as high level of professionalism and expertise can be assumed
- In this context, the lack of (qualified) nursing staff in Austria is of great importance [structural forms of violence]
- Collection of basic information □ different forms of violence, approaches to solutions, etc. □ taking into account the different cultures/countries
- Basis of the content and training comes from Austria

POSSIBLE BASIC LITERATURE

- Publication „Gewalt in der Pflege“, 2015 by Univ.-Prof. Dr. Jürgen Osterbrink
- Documents of the Federal Ministry through Pro Senectute
- Folder of Pro Senectute in low-threshold form for all target groups
- Note: the underlying literature is mostly older than five years

SURVEY METHOD

- Instead of an online questionnaire, in which 50 employees and 20 employers were to be interviewed, focus groups are conducted.
- The reason for that is the high effort associated with questionnaires for the respondents as well as reasons of effectiveness.
- One focus group with the management of elderly care and one focus group with staff will be conducted.
- Focus group participants should come from a wide variety of organisations (SeneCura, Caritas, Volkshilfe, etc.).
- The Focus groups will take place online via Zoom and will be recorded with the consent of the participants.
- A focus group should consist of a maximum of 10 people and be held as expert interviews.

- Discussion by Mr. Wallner and Mr. Osterbrink on contents
- Meeting Mrs. Steinbacher with Mr. Wallner
- Compilation of literature bases, Addition to existing literature
- Creation of a guideline for the focus groups
